

It was once again a year of physical growth as we received with delight our new library and our expanded guidance facilities. Personally I think, that the school is large enough, but I have long since given up forecasting the needs of this growing school system. It was a year of achievement in several sports; cross-country, wrestling, basketball, hockey, gymnastics; the Bell Bruins were always strong contenders. The exhibition in March drew thousands and was a resounding success.

It was more than usual a year of sadness, as the school mourned the sudden passing of two well-loved teachers, Mr. Remo Biolcati, our music director for the life of the school; and Miss Colleen McConville, a guidance teacher for two years.

Vice-Principal's Message

Congratulations to the Yearbook Committee for what I am sure will be an excellent record of the school year 1968-69 at Bell High School. It has been a year in which I have held two positions, (Vice-Principal until April and Principal from then until June) but have throughout worked with the same goals in mind.

Last year my message stated that our society expects each member "to contribute economically, socially and culturally" to that society. I feel that to accomplish the preceding, here in our society at Bell High School, each student must have a pride in our school and be informed of its activities. Personally I feel, that we have much to be proud of here at Bell High School. This year we opened what we feel is the best high school library in the area, "best" in facilities and "best" in the number of books circulated and the spirit in which these books are managed by our more-than-capable library staff. Although our "double noon-hour", necessary because of timetabling difficulties, curtailed our sports and club activities somewhat, we had a number of noteworthy activities.

The World Affairs club and our Band had exchanges with groups of students from other cities. A committee of senior students arranged an excellent two-day Film Festival during which all grade 12 and 13 students spent the entire two days watching various films and taking part in seminars led by visitors to our school. The student support of this Festival encouraged the teaching staff to proceed with our "May-day" programme. For two days all students of our school participated by small groups in projects selected by them from the more than 60 activities offered. Many of these projects were held outside the school as well as outside the regular curriculum. The "field trips" of May 1 and 2 were not the only occasions when students worked outside the school as, in nearly every subject, provision was made for learning experiences in the surrounding community. An example of this was the massive Careers Expo visited at the Civic Centre on April 28th.

Much is said these days about communications and I mentioned above that students need to be informed about our school. However, good communications must be "two-way", and this requires that people both speak and listen. In this regard, I was very pleased to see our Students' Council '69 expand its membership and communications to provide a better voice for all students. The class presidents were used on numerous occasions in communicating more completely with all of our students and the meetings which the teachers had with senior students "cleared the air" on at least two occasions.

To all students of our Bell High School, I extend best wishes for the future, whether you will be graduating, moving on to Sir Robert Borden, or returning to Bell next fall. I also say good-bye to our school as an administrator this June. However, I look forward to return-visits as a mathematics consultant in this area.

Editorial

A yearbook is so much a part of high school life that nearly everyone thinks it is produced, whole and as if by magic, by a group of unapproachable senior students. When I was in grade nine I sold ads for the Campanarius. I never felt that I knew the staff members or that they noticed me; I really believed that I could have helped more if I had let someone more capable take over my job. So for the next two years I just bought the book and didn't feel that it was any less mine because all I had contributed was a picture signifying that I existed at Bell.

Of course the yearbook belongs to each student, and we have tried to make it so this year by continuing the class pages introduced last year, by doubling the number of candid photographs, and by encouraging students to work in producing the book. We were not successful in involving people. I didn't realize until I became an editor that the unknown is not as frightening as it is made out to be. In the beginning, when I still thought in generalities, I was completely optimistic about the work to be done. It was later, when I realized what was expected of me, that the trouble started. Unfortunately, it was while I was learning that yearbooks are not produced by an infallible "someone else", that I came into contact with most of the younger students, and probably frightened them away, as I had been frightened myself. It's hard to remember that for someone else you have become the terror you yourself once dreaded.


But still, Bell students are very reluctant to participate in school life. Most of the seniors have complained about the lack of spirit here, and I think that this lack is the result, not of disinterest, but of the attitude that participation is not necessary now, because there will always be another time. We would much rather wait till the playoffs to go to a Bruins game, just as we put off studying math as long as we can; and because we want so much to become the masters of our lives in the future, we do not see the commitments we could be making now. So much is written about the rights and freedoms of teenagers that we seem to see ourselves as an isolated group; we forget that we are people. Others do not and can not control what we think and what we decide, for we must think for ourselves. This is not a "right" to be struggled for and achieved by activism; it is itself a choice which we ourselves must make.

The 1969 Campanarius was intended to be a committed book. As editor, I wish, that it could have been all that its staff hoped it might be. However we dreamed beyond our means and just didn't have the money to include everything. In fact if this book had a theme, this is it: "The intent and not the deed is in our power, and therefore who dares greatly, does greatly". (You may remember our dance.) But we did include all the people, and that's the essential thing.





IN MEMORIAM



MISS COLLEEN McCONVILLE

Perhaps the most spectacular change around Bell High School this year was the new John A. Dawson Library, an eight-sided building attached at the northeast corner. After spending six months en route to the new quarters, first in a classroom, and, from September to December, in the old Guidance area, everyone was thrilled when we finally burst out of our cramped space and began moving 15,000 volumes and office equipment into our bright new library.


Its red carpets, its gleaming black and white shelves and tables, its red and black upholstered chairs, its 21 study carrels on the mezzanine, its spacious lounge area, complete with carpets, drapes, tall plants, and modernistic furniture, all combine to beckon students and teachers. An essential item is the card catalogue, the present of Library Clubs of past years, which is custom-made to match the decor.


In spite of incredibly cramped quarters last fall, 4100 books were circulated, and in the first five weeks of operation in the new library, over 8000 were lent out; this 12,000 total is about one third of last year's total circulation of 33,000. Our biggest week was 1760, or, over 3/4 of the way to doubling last year's weekly circulation.

It was a l-o-n-g wait, but we're proud and happy now.
