Bell High School was founded in 1962, and was administered by the Collegiate Institute Board of Ottawa, until transferred to the newly-formed Carleton Board of Education in January, 1970.

Our first principal was Mr. McGillivray, who is now Superintendent of Academic Personnel for the Carleton Board. In September 1965, Mr. Gardner took over the duties of principal and Mr. McGillivray went to the University of Alberta, to take his master's degree in Education. In 1966, Mr. Gardner became principal of Woodroffe High School, and Mr. McGillivray returned to Bell. Mr. Fox took over the administration for three months in the late spring of 1969, when Mr. McGillivray left to take up his position with the Board. Mr. Fox went to the Department of Education as Programme Consultant for Mathematics, and Bell was pleased to welcome Mr. MacLean, who came to us from Confederation High School, where he had been vice-principal. Also new to the administrative staff was Mr. Robillard, who had previously been head of the Physical Education Department at Rideau High School.

Over the years, Bell has increased its numbers from 630 to 1100 students. Some of the achievements of Bell students in both academic and athletic fields in 1970 and 1971 are recorded in this Yearbook.

THE PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The arrival of the school yearbook is a sure sign that another year has come to a close. This has been a difficult year for our nation and for the world, and I know that crises have arisen in the lives of many of our students which will cause them to say, "I shall never be the same again." It is always so; there never was a year which was not difficult for some and critical for others. The only important fact is how well the nation or the individual responds to the difficulty or the crisis. I hope that it will always be with dignity and courage, and I see much evidence among the young people that I meet to sustain me in that hope.

Education is, as usual, in a state of crisis. There is much disagreement about what should be taught, how it should be taught, and to whom. Traditionalism is challenged by relevance, authoritarianism does battle with




freedom, excellence has to contend with mediocrity, but none of these struggles is new. The shcool is, as it always has been, in the middle, trying to make tradition relevant, trying to counter-balance freedom with responsibility and trying to get just a little more excellence than mediocrity is willing to yield. It will not always succeed, and the net effect of its efforts will not always be visible, but it will keep trying to have an influence on the lives of those whom it encounters.

In many ways, it has been a good year, and many Bell students have brought credit and a good name to the school.

I hope that all have found something here which will be of use to them in the future, and I congratulate the editor and all who helped him for providing this chronicle of 1970-'71.




GAIL BEGGS
