It was the first year for most of the yearbook staff, they learned quickly and produced the product you see.


I'd like to thank Mr. Murawsky whose first year it was also as adviser for helping us by checking every page.


We had 4 days of hard training before we were to represent Carleton in the Ottawa-Valley Championships. On






Boy's Volleyball


Girl's Gymnastics


Junior Badminton
